



Group Climbing Information Sheet

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Here is some useful information and answers to frequently asked questions. Please don't hesitate to contact us with any other questions you may have about your adventure.

Equipment

- We provide all climbing equipment, including shoes, harness, helmet and chalk.
- Please complete the attached size sheet and return it to us at least **one week** prior to your climb so we will be sure to have the correct equipment for you.
- You should refer to our attached climber's checklist for personal items you may want to bring.

Paperwork

- Please complete and return to us promptly after making your reservation the attached Group Reservation Form.
- Please complete and bring with you the waiver-of-liability forms attached:
 - Texas Climbing Adventures Liability Waiver
 - Park Liability Waiver
- Each of the liability waivers requires the additional signature of a parent or guardian for climbers not yet 18 years old.

Special Needs

- Please let us know if anyone in your group has medical or other special needs that we should be aware of so we can do everything possible to accommodate their requirements.

Camping

- We have a limited number of campsites available in the Enchanted Rock State Natural Area. Please let us know as soon as possible if you would like to book a campsite.
- If you would like to book directly at Enchanted Rock or would prefer one of their primitive campsites, the TPWD reservation line is 512-389-8900.

- An alternate location to try is Lady Bird Johnson Municipal Park in Fredericksburg, 17 miles away from Enchanted Rock State Natural Area, at 830-997-4202.
- There are several hotels in Fredericksburg as well if camping isn't your thing.

Payment

- At the time you made your reservation, we noted your credit card number and will charge that account when the climb has been completed.
- We ask that you re-confirm the number of people in your group at least **one week** before the climb. Maintaining an optimal student-guide ratio is important to us; and so, our guides are committed to your group's climb at this time. Individual no-shows after re-confirmation resulting in fewer climbers than were agreed will be charged at one-half the per-person rate agreed for your group. Cancellations of the entire group with less than 48 hours of notice forfeit the full course fee.

**TEXAS CLIMBING ADVENTURES
RELEASE OF LIABILITY, WAIVER OF CLAIMS, INDEMNIFICATION,
AND ARBITRATION AGREEMENT**

Notice – By signing this document you may be waiving certain legal rights, including the right to sue.

Release and Waiver of Claims; Indemnification Agreement

In consideration of being allowed to use the facilities and participate in programs and events ("Programs") operated by Texas Climbing Adventures (the "Host"), the Participant, and the Participant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) if the Participant is a minor, do hereby agree, to the fullest extent permitted by law, as follows:

- 1) **TO WAIVE ALL CLAIMS** that they have or may have against the Host arising out of the Participant's participation in the Programs or the use of any equipment provided by the Host ("Equipment"). **The Participant and his/her Parents or legal guardian(s) specifically understand that they are releasing, and do hereby release, any and all claims that arise or may arise from any negligent acts or conduct of the Host, its owners, affiliates, operators, employees, agents, and officers, to the fullest extent permitted by law.** However, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a release for conduct that is found to constitute gross negligence or intentional conduct;
- 2) **TO ASSUME ALL RISKS** of participating in the Programs and using the Equipment, **even those caused by the negligent acts or conduct of the Host, its owners, affiliates, operators, employees, agents, and officers.** The Participant and his/her Parents or legal guardian(s) understand that there are inherent risks of participating in the Programs and using the Equipment, which may be both foreseen and unforeseen and include serious physical injury and death;
- 3) **TO RELEASE** the Host, its owners, affiliates, operators, employees, agents, and officers from all liability for any loss, damage, injury, death, or expense that the Participant (or his/her next of kin) may suffer, arising out of his/her participation in the Programs and use of the Equipment, including while receiving instruction and/or training; and
- 4) **TO INDEMNIFY** the Host, its owners, affiliates, operators, employees, agents, and/or officers, from all liability for any loss, damage, injury, death, or expense that the Participant (or his/her next of kin) may suffer, arising out of participation in Programs and use of the Equipment.

Arbitration

The Participant, and the Participant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if Participant is a minor, hereby agrees to submit any dispute arising from participation in the Programs, for which Participant intends to seek damages in excess of \$75,000.00, to binding arbitration. Submission shall be unlimited. For such disputes, there shall be a three-member arbitration panel, consisting of two party-appointed arbitrators (one arbitrator to be appointed by each party) and one neutral arbitrator (collectively, the "Panel"), to be chosen by the party-appointed arbitrators. The neutral arbitrator shall be an officer or director of any entity that operates a rock climbing guide service in the United States. In the event that the two party-appointed arbitrators are not able to agree on a third, neutral arbitrator, the neutral arbitrator shall be appointed by the United States District Court, for the Western District of Texas, utilizing the selection criteria for the neutral as set forth above. Each party shall pay its own costs, including the costs associated with the party-appointed arbitrators, and the parties shall share equally the costs associated with the neutral arbitrator. The arbitration proceeding shall proceed in the county and state in which the Programs occurred and shall be governed by the Federal Rules of Evidence. The Panel shall establish a reasonable and appropriate discovery schedule to expeditiously resolve this matter. In the event that Participant, or the Participant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if Participant is a minor, files a lawsuit in any court relating to, and/or arising from, Participant's participation in the Programs, Participant and/or Participant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), by signing this document, stipulate

to a cap on Participant's damages of \$75,000.00, exclusive of interest and costs. As a threshold matter, the Panel, or the Court (if a lawsuit is filed), shall confirm whether the Waiver and Release contained in this Agreement are enforceable under applicable law.

Photography/Videography Release

Participant hereby grants to the Host, its representatives, and employees the right to take **photographs and video of Participant** in connection with Participant's participation in the Programs. Participant hereby authorizes the Host to copyright, use, and publish the same in print and/or electronically. Participant hereby agrees that the Host may use such photographs and video of Participant for any lawful purpose, including but not limited to publicity, illustration, advertising, and Web content.

Personal Responsibility

The Participant certifies that he/she has no physical or mental condition that precludes him/her from participating in the Programs and that he/she is not participating against medical advice.

If helmets are recommended for use while participating in the Programs, and Participant chooses not to wear a helmet, he/she does so at his/her own risk and accepts full responsibility for any injury that results.

The Participant understands that his/her participation in the Programs is voluntary and further understands that he/she has the opportunity to inspect the Host's equipment and location before any participation.

The Participant understands that he/she is obligated to follow the rules of the Programs and that he/she can minimize his/her risk of injury by doing so and through the exercise of *common sense* and by being aware of his/her surroundings.

If, while participating in the Programs, the Participant observes any unusual hazard, which he/she believes jeopardizes his/her personal safety or that of others, he/she will remove himself/herself from participation in the Programs and immediately bring said hazard to the attention of the Host.

I, _____ (parent/legal guardian), hereby agree that I will explain to my child that the risk of injury while participating in the Programs can be reduced by following the rules and through the use of *common sense* and *good judgment*.

To the extent that any portion of this Agreement is deemed to be invalid under the law of the applicable jurisdiction, the remaining portions of the Agreement shall remain binding and available for use by the Host and its counsel in any proceeding.

I HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS AGREEMENT AND I AM AWARE THAT BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT I MAY BE WAIVING CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS, INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO SUE.

Parents or Guardians must also sign if the Participant is UNDER 18.
